THE GOSPEL OF JOHN Chapter 11

INTRODUCTION...

In Chapter Eleven Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead...no doubt one of his greatest miracles. As you read pay close attention to why Jesus allowed Lazarus to die. The Lord allows us to go through hard times so we can learn about how great He truly is in His ability to lift us up out of suffering. Though sometimes we may feel the Lord is too late in coming through for us, we must always remember nothing is too hard for our God.

Be sure that you read the questions carefully to make sure that you have answered the complete question. You will notice that some of the questions may have more than one part.

Remember that you will be using the Inductive Bible Study (IBS) method of study. Which means that in each study you will be required to make observations, interpretations and application of what you have observed and interpreted? (see further explanation in Study #1)

What do we know about Mary's relationship with Jesus from vs. 29?

AWhat is the personal application for us in this verse?
What do we learn about Jesus from vs. 35? (Be specific)
Why did Jesus cry?
What kind of tomb was Lazarus buried in?
Why did Jesus pray out loud?
AWhat do we learn about our prayer life from Jesus' prayer?
