THE GOSPEL OF JOHN Chapter 18

INTRODUCTION...

Chapter 18 begins the trial and crucifixion process of Jesus. After having prayed for His disciples and preparing them for His departure, Jesus then proceeds to love them to the end (13:1). Knowing all that He should undergo, He willingly gives himself up for the sake of His people...He drinks the cup the Father gives him. Likewise, as believers in Jesus, as those purified by his blood for the sake of glorifying God, we too must drink the cup the Father gives us. Unlike Jesus' cup of punishment, our cup is one filled with mercy and grace, but also mandates a giving up of ourselves to God for His purposes. The next time you are struggling with giving something up for the sake of Jesus, remember what He gave up for us...HIS LIFE!

Be sure that you read the questions carefully to make sure that you have answered the complete question. You will notice that some of the questions may have more than one part.

Remember that you will be using the Inductive Bible Study (IBS) method of study. Which means that in each study you will be required to make observations, interpretations and application of what you have observed and interpreted? (see further explanation in Study #1)

THIS WEEKS BIBLE STUDY...CHAPTER EIGHTEEN...

Be sure and pray before you begin your bible study, asking the Lord to reveal those things that He wants you to know from the text you are reading.

Read through the chapter, at least twice, and then answer the following questions. Be sure to write the Scripture reference to support your answer.

SPECIAL NOTE: The last four chapters of the Gospel of John tell about the arrest, crucifixion, resurrection and ascension of Jesus. These events are the corner stone of the Gospel. Without the death of Jesus, we would have no atonement for our sins; without His resurrection we would have no proof that Jesus is the Messiah; without His ascension we would have no advocate to the Father on our behalf and no Helper to guide us in our walk. It is of the utmost importance that we understand these events as fully as possible. That is why it is vital that we look at what all four Gospel accounts tell us about these events. In order to accurately answer the following questions you will need to read and reference all four Gospel accounts on the events. Be sure to sight your specific scripture references for your answers.
